

# RADIOLOGY PRE-PROCEDURE PHYSICIAN'S ORDERS

**Stop Anticoagulant/Antiplatelet:**

- Warfarin (Coumadin) on \_\_\_\_\_ (date)
- Clopidrogel (Plavix) on \_\_\_\_\_ (date)
- Heparin on \_\_\_\_\_ (date)
- Enoxaparin (Lovenox) on \_\_\_\_\_ (date)
- Hold \_\_\_\_\_ (specify insulin type) Insulin the morning of the procedure
- Stop metformin (Glucophage) on \_\_\_\_\_ (date)

**IV Contrast Reaction Prep: Ordering Physician to give prescription if outpatient**

- Predisone 50mg BID the day before procedure, with supper and at bedtime.
- Diphenhydramine (Benadryl) 50mg at bedtime the night before procedure.
- Morning of procedure prednisone 50mg PO and diphenhydramine (Benadryl) 50mg PO

**IF NO PREP and possible contrast reaction:**

- Give hydrocortisone (Solucortef) 100mg IV and diphenhydramine (Benadryl) 50mg PO x 1 dose prior to procedure
- See Prevention of Contrast Induced Nephropathy Order Set**
